

Whole Child Support Trainings/Workshops

While Metro RESA works with school district personnel to accommodate most of the professional learning and training needs within school districts, we also offer a small number of trainings through our agency which can accommodate educators across districts. These trainings are particularly helpful for districts who have only a few schools requesting various content, and do not have enough to conduct a full training within the district or for schools who were unable to attend a training offered in district due to scheduling conflicts. We also welcome individual participants who are looking to build their own knowledge, or school teams looking to build capacity.

STUDENT ENGAGEMENT INTERVENTION



Check & Connect (C&C) is an evidence-based intervention used with K-12 students who show warning signs of disengagement with school and who are at risk of dropping out. There are four core components to implementing C&C with fidelity —

- 1. Mentor
- 2. "Check"
- 3. "Connect"
- 4. Family Engagement

- · Persistence in school
- · Credit accrual
- · School completion rates



- Truancy
- Tardies
- Behavioral referrals
- Dropout rates


