- Conduct FBA/BIP fidelity rubric checks and BIP Walkthroughs
- Serve as the PBIS Coach and complete all PBIS Task List Duties
- Work with teachers to improve classroom management and school climate through the implementation of effective instructional methods
- Serve as the secondary testing administrator for the North Metro GNETS program
- · Provide modeled lessons for teachers in all four content areas as well as social emotional learning
- Provide iReady Data Chats and model lessons
- Provide Edgenuity Data Chats and model lessons
- Provide support and use of Unique Learning Systems in ASD/GAA classrooms
- Serve as a Special Education Diagnostician for the North Metro GNETS Program in collaboration with the North Metro GNETS School Psychologist

- Serve as a classroom teacher in the absence of a teacher
- Implement ALL aspects of the North Metro GNETS Strategic Plan with integrity and fidelity
- Crisis Prevention and Restraint Training certification is required for all North Metro GNETS employees.
- Ability to carry out student restraint procedures according to guidelines provided in training.
- Ability to lift objects and some running and climbing may be required. Requires ability to lift up to 25 pounds.
